May 10 USA Your pilgrimage begins as you depart the USA.

May 11 Ancient Rome Arrive in Rome and enjoy a panoramic tour of Ancient Rome before transferring to the port of Civitavecchia to board the beautiful Royal Caribbean Mariner of the Seas.

May 12 Sicily Dock this morning on the island of Sicily where Paul spent three days (Acts 28:12). You'll enjoy a spectacular view of Mt. Etna as you explore the town of Syracuse, once an important Greek colony known as the "most beautiful of all cities." In Syracuse, you can see Greek and Roman buildings everywhere in the city.

May 13 Day at Sea

May 14 Corinth and Athens Travel to Corinth (Acts 18: 1-18), a city that inspired St. Paul's most familiar letter. You will visit the Archaeological Museum, the Market Place, and Temples. Walk among the ruins and stand on the Bema where Paul stood. Read Paul's letter to the Corinthians and visualize his address to the Gentiles as he began the task of building Corinth's church. The architectural splendors of the ancient city of Athens are as magical as ever. View the world-renowned Acropolis, the Propylaea, and the Parthenon. Time permitting view Mars Hill where Paul debated with the intellectual community of his day. Walk among the ruins of the Agora, ancient market place and center of Athenian public life, where Paul preached to the skeptical Athenians. You will view the Olympic Stadium, where the ancient Olympics began and where the games returned in 2004.

May 15 Rhodes Paul visited Rhodes briefly on his way to Jerusalem at the end of his 3rd missionary journey (Acts 21:1). Centuries later the crusaders known as the Knights of St. John fled Jerusalem and settled on the Island of Rhodes. You will see the castles and the old city they built which still impress visitors. The knights lasted for two centuries until they plundered one too many Moslem pilgrim ships, enraging Suleiman the Magnificent who lost 50 thousand men in his successful bid to take the island

May 16 Ephesus Journey to Ephesus, the marble city where Paul spent three years of his ministry. It was to this community that Paul may have written his Epistle to the Ephesians. The ruins of Ephesus have been restored much like the city was in Paul's time. You will visit the ancient Agora and imagine where Demetrius, the silversmith, sold his silver shrines of the Greek goddess Artemis. You will enter the Great Theater and have a communion service in the place where Paul witnessed faithfully for Christ.

May 17 Day at Sea

May 18 Cairo Begin your tour of Cairo with a visit to the Egypt Museum which houses the King Tut treasures and many other artifacts from Egypt's long history. Visit the Great Pyramids of Giza, the last remaining ancient wonder, built before Moses and the Israelites were even in this ancient land.

May 19 Alexandria Dock in Alexandria, founded in 331 BC by Alexander the Great. See the site of the ancient library, lighthouse, and Pompey's Pillar during your tour of Alexandria. Visit the catacombs and enjoy time to explore the old city. This evening set sail for Rome.

May 22 Naples and Pompeii In the early morning, your ship will dock in Naples, a dazzling city perched on a beautiful rock coast. The city remained buried and undiscovered for almost 1500 years until excavation began in 1748. These excavations continue today, providing insight into life during the Roman Empire.

May 23 - Drive to Pisa Your journey continues as you travel to **Pisa** where you can snap your photo in front of the famous **Leaning Tower**. This 180 foot tall round tower is over 10 degrees out of perpendicular. In the past, some thought the tower was designed to lean. In fact, it was designed to stand straight and tall. The tower began to lean during its construction in 1173 and corrective efforts failed. Even if it did not lean, it would still be one of the most remarkable bell towers in Europe. While the tower is a great source of pride for the town's people, it is just one of several renowned buildings in the center of Pisa.

May 24 - Florence The elegant city of **Florence** is nestled between a line of hills and the banks of the **Arno River**. During your stay, you will have time to enjoy the beautiful gardens and stroll through the open-air markets. Every street, every square and winding alley of Florence is a showcase for Romanesque, Gothic and Renaissance grandeur. Among the wealth of masterpieces to be found in Florence, you'll see the **Piazza della Signoria** with its **Neptune Fountain** and **Vecchio Palace**, the **Santa Maria del Fiore Cathedral** which houses **Michelangelo's unfinished Pietá**, the **Baptistry** which features Ghiberti's famous **Gates of Paradise** and the **Academy** where you can view some of **Michelangelo's finished and unfinished work**, including the awe-inspiring **David**.

May 25 - Assisi Today, you will journey to **Assisi**, a charming medieval town which was the home of St. Francis. Just two years after his death, the large **Basilica** was started in his

memory. At one time, the land on which the church stands was an execution ground for condemned criminals. In his humility, St. Francis asked to be buried there and it became known as the **Hill of Paradise**. The church contains his tomb and many great works of art. Overnight in Rome area.
