April 28 and 29 ~ Day 1 and 2 Depart USA and Arrive England We arrival in London and visit **West Wycombe Park**. This is a perfectly preserved rococo landscape garden surrounded by a neo-classical mansion. This magnificent mansion is among the most theatrical in England. Its facades formed as classical temples. The lavishly decorated house has been featured in many films and television series' including *The Importance of Being Earnest*, *Vanity Fair*, *Little Dorrit* and the award winning *Cranford Chronicles*. Continue to your hotel in the midlands where we will spend the next 6 nights.

April 30 ~ Day 3 Packwood House / Baddesle Today you will visit the Packwood house, an excellent Tudor Manor House, with a fascinating and lavish interior and renowned collections of stained glass and tapestry. A wall garden offers a ride of color throughout the spring. You will continue your visit to Baddesley Clinton which features a medieval moated manor house and garden and has enchanting gardens as well as the house dates from the 15th century.

May 1 ~ Day 4 Hanbury Hall / Coughton Court Visit today Hanbury Hall, which is an early 18th century country house with a garden and park. William and Mary style house has magnificent staircase and ceiling murals and 19th century formal gardens. Also you will visit Coughton Court, an imposing Tudor house set in beautiful gardens. Considered one of the finest Tudor houses in England. The house features fine collection of furniture, porcelain, and Portraiture.

May 2 ~ Day 5 Hidcote Manor Garden / Broadway / Upton House Gardens Today we visit Hidcote Manor Garden, considered to be one of the most beautiful gardens in the world. It is a celebrated 20th century garden in the beautiful North Cotswolds. This is a series of outdoor rooms, each with its own unique character. The flowers are beautiful at this time of year. You will have some time at lunch to visit nearby Broadway considered one of the quaintest villages in England in the heart of the Cotswolds. Continue in the afternoon visiting Upton House Gardens. This house and gardens were presented in the 1930's, composed of a mansion and terrace gardens with an outstanding art and porcelain collection. Get a taste of country house life as you step into the home of the 1930s millionaire Walter Samuel, chairman of Shell Oil. His art collection is well known and consists of some of the greatest painters and artists in the world. Sweeping lawn gives way to a dramatic series of terraced and herbaceous borders, which descend to a kitchen garden and tranquil water garden.

May 3 ~ Day 6 Kedleston Hall / Hardwick Hall Visit Kedleston Hall. This is a spectacular 18th century mansion and is a masterpiece of neoclassical architecture, designed by famous Robert Adams. Luxurious staterooms contain their original collections of paintings, sculpture, and furniture. It served as a location for the movie "The Duchess." We will then visit Hardwick Hall, one of Britain's greatest and most complete Elizabethan houses. This spectacular Tudor treasure house features 16th and 17th century tapestries and embroideries.

May 4 ~ Day 7 Stow-on-the-Wold / Bourton-on-the-Water / Charlecote Park This morning we visit Stow-on-the-Wold, highest point in the Cotswolds and a 15th century town. Enjoy walking in this town, which was once the largest sheep market in Britain and visit St. James church. We continue then to visit the lovely and beautiful village of the Bourton-on-the-Water. This, for many, is the most beautiful village in all of England. Time will be given for lunch and for strolling and seeing the five walking bridges across the Windrush River. Finally, in the afternoon we will visit Charlecote Park, which features a superb Tudor house and landscaped deer park. Colorful landscaped gardens dominate this area by the River Avon. Perhaps you will see some deer.

May 5 ~ Day 8 Waddesdon Manor We will travel to Waddesdon Manor to see one of the most magnificent houses in all of England and Europe and the grounds in the style of a 19th century French chateau. It was built for the Rothchild's in the late 19th century and has a world-renowned collection of French furniture, paintings and decorative arts. Its beautiful gardens are also an added treat. This house is much larger than The Biltmore House, the largest in the USA. We continue on to the Heathrow area for our overnight.

May 6 ~ Day 9 Return We will depart from Heathrow for the USA this morning.

Castles, Abbeys and Gardens of England Post-Tour

May 6 ~ BATH ASSEMBLY ROOMS We depart Heathrow in London and continue to the **Bath Assembly Rooms**, home to the Fashion Museum. The luxurious public rooms you will enter are examples of the fashionably aristocratic life in Bath during the late 18th century. Continue to our hotel in Bristol and overnight.

May 7 ~ DYRHAM PARK / TYNTESFIELD Today we visit **Dyrham Park**. This territory was built during the reign of King William III and Queen Mary II of England. The architecture includes an astounding late 17th century mansion with a striking antique collection purporting the fashion for "all things Dutch." A garden and deer park about the estate, making the area a scenic dream. The location was selected as the setting for the movie, "Remains of the Day." The next stop is **Tyntesfield**, a beautiful Victorian style country house and garden. You may notice a slight flare of Gothic influence, no doubt incurred during the Period's revival. Step outside and gaze upon the towers and belfrys adorning the building; all were added over a span of four generations. Visit the arboretum and take the time to find the eight champion trees on the land.

May 8 ~ GREAT CHALFIELD MANOR / COURT'S GARDEN The **Great Chalfield Manor** has many characteristics in the style of the Middle Ages. The manor is ringed with a moat, and stands beside a gatehouse and small parish church. Within the manor walls are precious Oriel windows and doors. It was the film location for "Persuasion," and "The Other Boleyn Girl." We continue our visit to the **Court's Garden**, which is a delightful, nice country garden full of mystery, variety, and color. It has peaceful water gardens planted with irises and lilies.

May 9 ~ BARRINGTON COURT / MONTACUTE HOUSE We visit **Barrington Court** with its beautiful Gertrude Jekyll-inspired gardens, kitchen gardens, and Tudor manor house. This enchanting formal garden lays out in a series of walled rooms washed with color. The working stonewalled kitchen garden produces a variety of wonderful fruits and vegetables. The Arboretum delights visitors with its beautiful colors. We continue with a visit to the **Montacute House**, which features a magnificent Elizabethan Ham-stone house, incorporating a portrait gallery exhibition, garden, and park. It is a magnificent glittering mansion built in the late 16th century for Sir. Edward Phelips. Renaissance highlights include elegant chimneys, carved parapets, and contemporary plasterwork and heraldic glass. It has the longest grand gallery of its kind in Europe. Admire more than 50 of the finest Tudor and Elizabethan portraits from the National Portrait Gallery collection.

May 10 ~ BUCKLAND ABBEY / COMPTON CASTLE We visit **Buckland Abbey**, which is a 700-year-old home of Elizabethan seafarers Drake and Grenville. This was also the original home to Cisterian monks before Drake and Grenville. Wander through the monastic great barn and Elizabethan garden to reach the abbey with its displays revealing the lives and stories behind two men who changed the shape of the house and the fate of the country. Continue your visit to **Compton Castle**. It is a dramatic fortified manor house and has small, formal gardens. It is the home for most of the past 600 years to the Gilbert family including Sir Humphrey Gilbert, half-brother of Sir Walter Raleigh. This imposing castle set against the backdrop of rolling hills and orchards invokes a bewitching mixture of romance and history.

May 11 ~ ANTONY / SALTRAM **Antony** is a superb early 18th century mansion set in the Parkland and Fine gardens. It is flanked by colonnaded wings of mellow brick. This classical beautiful house is a beguiling mixture of the formal and informal, the venerable and the moderate. It contains divine collections of paintings, furniture, and textiles. Includes formal gardens with topiary etc. We then continue to **Saltram**, a magnificent Georgian house with opulent Robert Adam interiors, gardens, follies, and landscape parkland. It is a result of centuries of sophistication and extravagance. Saltram is close to Plymouth and yet in a world of its own. It provides a fascinating insight into country estate life throughout the centuries.

May 12 ~ LACOCK ABBEY / FOX TALBOT MUSEUM AND VILLAGE We depart for Heathrow but we make a very important and significant stop at **Lacock Abbey**. This is a country house created out of a medieval cloistered abbey converted into a fine country home of William Talbot, a pioneer of photography. The home features newly restored botanic gardens and greenhouse, and has a fascinating museum dedicated to the "Father of Modern Photography." Lacock Abbey has been the location for many movie films: Harry Potter, Pride and Prejudice, Cranford, The Other Boleyn Girl, and Wolfman. Afterward our visit, continue to the Heathrow area for our overnight.

May 13 ~ DEPART for USA We will depart from Heathrow and arrive in the USA.
