All Tour participants will be requested to give EO their hotel information in anticipation of their pick up on the morning of July 6. They should plan to stay in their hotels through the night of July 5 / morning of July 6. Buses will pick up guests at their hotels between 9 and 10 a.m. on July 6

Day 1 - 06 July (M) – William Booth College for Officer Training and International Heritage Center – Denmark Hill, Kennington Common, Abney Park Cemetery

Built by General Bramwell Booth and for over six decades known as the International Training College, it is now the training college for the United Kingdom with the Republic of Ireland Territory. **The International Heritage Centre** has been in several locations, but now is permanently housed in the **William Booth College for Officer Training, Kennington Common** was an Open Air speaking venue for Wesley, Whitefield and Booth. **Abney Park Cemetery** is the burial site of William and Catherine Booth, next to their son Bramwell Booth and various Commissioners, including Elijah Cadman, Frederick Booth-Tucker, George Scott Railton, Theodore Kitching and T. Henry Howard. This afternoon, check into your hotel and enjoy some free time. We will have a Welcome Meeting this evening following dinner.

Day 2 - 07 July (T) – Wesley and International Headquarters

Begin your journey with **St Botolph's Church**, one of the largest parish churches in England. It is the site of the Moravian meeting room where John Wesley reaffirmed his faith. It has the fourteenth highest church tower in England. John Wesley left his mark on the town of London. Lecture at **City Road Chapel**, site of Wesley's home and grave. Across the street in **Bunhill Fields Cemetery**, Susanna Wesley is buried along with other famous personages such as Isaac Watts, John Bunyan and Daniel Defoe. You will walk on **Aldersgate Street** where on May 24, 1738, John Wesley had his "Warming of the Heart" experience. You will walk past the entrance of "**Little Britain**" where Charles Wesley had his conversion experience just three days earlier. You will visit **St. Paul's Cathedral** where John Wesley often worshipped. On the day of his conversion, Wesley came here for an afternoon service and was deeply moved by the choir's anthem, "*Out of the Deep Have I Called Unto Thee, O Lord*". This afternoon, we will visit **The Salvation Army International Headquarters**. The property was originally purchased by William Booth and became the International Headquarters of The Salvation Army in 1881. Sixty years later the building was destroyed by fire during the Second World War. The rebuilt headquarters was opened by Queen Elizabeth, the Queen Mother, in 1963. In 2001, IHQ took up residence in the **William Booth College** when it was decided to redevelop the site in Queen Victoria Street. The new building was opened by HRH The Princess Royal on November 9, 2004. The **Queen's Walk** runs from St. Paul's Cathedral past the front doors of the International Headquarters and across the Thames River on the Millennium Bridge.

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Day 3 - 08 July (W) – East End of London - Blind Beggar Pub - William Booth Memorial bust and statue - Quaker Burial Ground – City Temple

The Christian Mission began its work in this area on July 2, 1865. A memorial bust and statue of **William Booth** commemorate that inauspicious beginning. William Booth is prominently featured on a mural on the wall of a nearby building commemorating the important people of East London. William Booth preached in front of the **Blind Beggar Pub** (the present site being a later construction), and preached in a tent on the **Quaker Burial Ground**. Salvation Army ministries remain active in the East End. **City Temple** is the place of the last public sermon of Catherine Booth, preached on June 21, 1888. She was unable to preach in public following this sermon because she was ill with cancer. The interior of the church was bombed in World War II, but the facade of the church was preserved.

Note that these sites will be visited over the course of these two days. Due to the capacity of certain sites, buses will not travel to the same sites at the same time, allowing everyone more time at each site.

Day 4 - 09 July (H) –Bristol, and Oxford

In the ancient port city of **Bristol**, enjoy a lecture in one of Wesley's early centers of ministry - the "**New Room**". This oldest Methodist building in the world is unusually attractive in its simplicity. Then visit the home of Charles Wesley, the famous hymn writer. Learn about the educational background of the Wesley brothers John, Charles and Samuel, Jr. when you view **Christ Church** and **Lincoln Colleges** at **Oxford University**. See the **Sheldonian Theater**, the place where William Booth received the honorary degree (D.C.L.) from Oxford.

Day 5 - 10 July (F) – Hadleigh Farm, Sneinton, Ashbourne, Nottingham

Visit **Hadleigh Farm**, a working farm. The colony was purchased by William Booth as part of the farm colony system of the **In Darkest England Scheme**. It is still owned and operated by The Salvation Army today. In **Ashbourne**, see the birthplace of Catherine Booth. In **Sneinton**, see the birthplace of William Booth and visit **St Stephen's Church**, where he was baptized. In **Nottingham**, you will take a glimpse of William Booth's life when you see the site of the church he attended, where he went to school, and the pawn shop where he worked.



Day 6 - 11 July (S) – Nottingham

Today we will visit the exciting city of **Nottingham**. Enjoy time in the **William Booth Memorial Corps Hall**. Overnight in Nottingham area.

Day 7 - 12 July (U) – York

Today we enter the old walled city of **York** with its ancient walls and history dating back 2000 years. We will worship together at **York Citadel**. Overnight in York.

Day 8 - 13 July (M) Epworth – St Andrews, Old Rectory, Wesley Memorial Church

We will have time to further enjoy **York** before driving through the quiet English countryside and green, rolling hills to remote **Epworth** in the **Fen Country**. Here **Samuel** and **Susanna Wesley** raised their brood of children in the **Old Rectory** while he served the Parish Church for 39 years. You will become familiar with the upbringing and early life of **John** and **Charles Wesley** when you visit their childhood home. You will see **Memorial Church**, built with contributions from around the world, and **St. Andrews Church**.



Day 9 - 14 July (T) – Stratford-Upon-Avon, Sunbury Court

You will glimpse life as it was in the day of **William Shakespeare** when you visit his birthplace in **Stratford-upon-Avon**, as well as drive past the **Holy Trinity Church**, where he is buried. Not far away, he courted his wife, **Anne Hathaway**, in the garden of her delightful thatched-roof cottage. At **Sunbury Court**, enjoy a leisurely afternoon at **The Salvation Army Conference Center**. **Sunbury Court** is well known by Salvationists as the site where the High Council meets to elect the General. Overnight at Heathrow area hotel.

Day 10 - 15 July (W) – Return Home, Stay in London (on your own), or Take the Ireland Extension

15 Jul (W) Cork, Cobh, Blarney

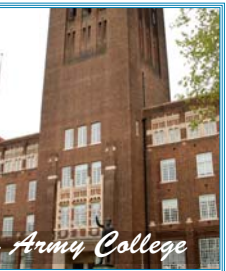
Depart England on your flight to **Cork, Ireland**. Our representatives will meet you at the airport and transfer you to your Irish bus as we head for **Cobh**. Here, you will visit the Heritage Center. From this port, between 1845 and 1860, 2.5 million people sailed to America.

If you had an ancestor who came from Ireland to America, chances are they departed from this very place. Find your family name on the archived passenger lists. You can enjoy the multimedia exhibition and the railway station that has been completely refurbished in the style of the era. Visit **Blarney Castle** and **Blarney Woollen Mills Shop**. At the Castle of **Blarney** you will see the fabled **Blarney Stone**. Legend says that those who kiss the stone acquire a gift of eloquence. Check into your **Cork** area hotel for dinner and overnight.



16 Jul (H) Ring of Kerry, Waterville, Muckross House

Delight in some of the most spectacular scenery as you travel the **Ring of Kerry**. Pause at the seaside village of **Waterville**. Here **Charlie Chaplin** owned a summer home, and **Payne Stewart** was Club Captain of the local Golf Course. Visit the 19th century **Muckross House**. You will enjoy this magnificent Victorian mansion that is considered one of Ireland's leading stately homes. You will experience the elegance of the day when you see the elegantly furnished rooms. Downstairs, however, reveals

the working conditions of the servants employed in the house. Return to **Cork** for dinner and overnight.

17 Jul (F) Rock of Cashel, Holy Cross Abbey, Rock of Dunamase, Dublin

See the **Rock of Cashel**, the traditional seat of Irish kings. Here

St. Patrick is thought to have converted the **King of Munster**. The present ruins are from structures built in the 12 and 13th Centuries, during the **Norman** era. See the restored **Holy Cross Abbey**, whose roots go back to 1233 AD. See the romantic ruins of the **Rock of Dunamase**. Abandoned since the 1300's, it was once home to the **Strongbow**, the **Norman Richard de Clare**. Continue on to **Dublin** for dinner and overnight.

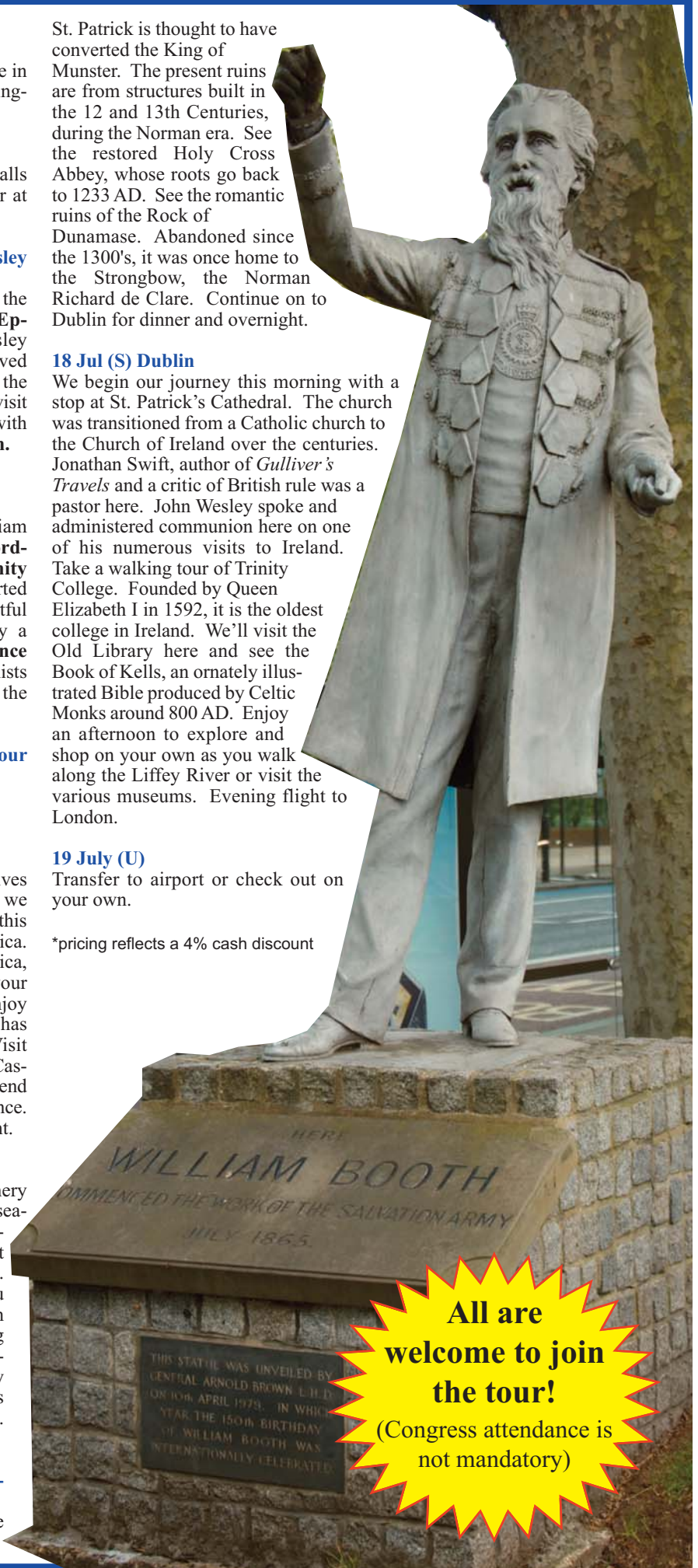
18 Jul (S) Dublin

We begin our journey this morning with a stop at **St. Patrick's Cathedral**. The church was transitioned from a **Catholic** church to the **Church of Ireland** over the centuries. **Jonathan Swift**, author of *Gulliver's Travels* and a critic of British rule was a pastor here. **John Wesley** spoke and administered communion here on one of his numerous visits to Ireland. Take a walking tour of **Trinity College**. Founded by **Queen Elizabeth I** in 1592, it is the oldest college in Ireland. We'll visit the **Old Library** here and see the **Book of Kells**, an ornately illustrated Bible produced by **Celtic Monks** around 800 AD. Enjoy an afternoon to explore and shop on your own as you walk along the **Liffey River** or visit the various museums. Evening flight to **London**.
