Day 1 (T) - Depart USA

Day 2 (Day 5) (W) - Join with Pre-Tour Group in Dublin...Welcome to Ireland

Upon arrival at the Dublin Airport, our representative will greet you and escort you to your bus. Pass through the Irish Midlands, where Wesley repeatedly returned to preach and shepherd the circuits and societies. Enjoy a walking tour of Galway to experience its atmosphere and see Lynch Castle (home to the mayors of Galway), Saint Nicholas Church founded in the 13th century, and the famous Spanish Arch. Walk along the Corrib River to the Claddagh village or to the majestic Cathedral. Enjoy a cruise on Lough Corrib (complete with tea and scones) where you will see unsurpassed views of the historic monuments and natural amenities that make this one of the most spectacular waterways in Ireland. Continue to your Galway hotel for dinner, overnight and a full Irish breakfast in the morning.

Day 3 (H) - Connemara

Depart for Connemara, a land of lakes and rivers, bogs and mountains, stone walls and thatched cottages. On its northern shore are spectacular views of the ocean and the beautiful fjord of Killarney Harbour. Continue on to Kylemore Abbey, located in the Kylemore Pass in Connemara. One of Kylemore Abbey's most famous features is its miniature Gothic cathedral, built in 1870. Today, the abbey is home to an Irish order of Benedictine nuns who bought the house in 1920, having fled their convent in war-torn Belgium in 1914. Continue to Cong for a stroll through the history of Ireland and its people. Make a photo stop at Ashford Castle, founded by the Anglo-Norman de Burgo family following their defeat of the native O'Connors of Connaught. Enjoy dinner, overnight and a full Irish breakfast at your hotel in Galway.

Day 4 (F) - The Burren, Cliffs of Moher and Adare

This morning, head for the Burren, a karst limestone region crisscrossed by cracks known as grykes through which grow a myriad of wild flowers. The Burren contains dozens of megalithic tombs and Celtic crosses. Look out over the Cliffs of Moher, situated on the Atlantic Ocean. Standing 230 meters above the sea at their highest point, the cliffs boast one of the most amazing views in Ireland. Adare is regarded as one of Ireland's most picturesque villages, with thatched cottages dotted throughout the town. This atmosphere was created by the 3rd Earl of Dunraven in the 1820's for his estate workers. The village has a Desmond castle and a Manor, once the home of Lord Dunraven. Visit the Franciscan Friary Adare; John Wesley preached to the people of Adare in 1765 from the shade of an ash tree close to the east wall of the Franciscan Friary. Today a stone marks the site where this tree stood, and each year Methodists hold a ceremony here in June. Stop at Ballingrane to visit the Embury Heck Memorial Church which John Wesley visited thirteen times over the years. Have dinner, overnight and a full Irish breakfast at your hotel in Killarney.

Day 5 (S) - Ring of Kerry

Enjoy a full day tour of the Ring of Kerry, one of the most famous and panoramic routes in Ireland. You'll pass the birthplace of national hero Daniel O'Connel, and continue on to the town of Waterville. Pass through Sneem Village, famous for its brightly colored houses. Visit

Muckross House & Gardens, a magnificent Victorian mansion built in 1843 and one of Ireland's leading stately homes, situated amidst the spectacular scenery of Killarney National Park. The elegantly furnished rooms portray the lifestyle of the landed gentry, while downstairs one can experience the working conditions of the servants. The Gardens of Muckross House are famed for their beauty worldwide. Dinner, overnight and full Irish breakfast are at your hotel in Killarney.

Day 6 (U) - Worship in Killarney and Blarney Castle

This morning, worship with a local Methodist congregation before continuing on to Blarney Castle near Cork. An ancient stronghold of the McCarthy's, it is one of Ireland's oldest and most historic castles. Built in 1446, Blarney Castle is famous for its "Blarney Stone," traditionally believed to have the power to bestow the gift of eloquence upon all those who kiss it. Travel to the port city of Kinsale for dinner and overnight.

Day 7 (M) - Kinsale & Cobh

Start your day in the port city of Kinsale by taking a trip to the famed Charles Fort, one of the finest examples of a 17th century Star Fort. Visit Desmond Castle, home to the Earls of Desmond from 1500. St. Multrose Church was built in 1190, and remains in use to this day. The courthouse was used for the inquiry over the sinking of the Lusitania in 1915. Continue to Cobh, a town that developed at the end of the 18th century when Cork was used as a harbor for British military ships. Transatlantic ships such as the Queen Mary or the Queen Elizabeth used to stop in Cobh, and thousands of Irish emigrants also transited through here. Today Cobh is a pleasant town, its streets climbing the steep slope of a hill crowned by St. Coleman's Cathedral with its carillon of 47 bells. Enjoy a walking tour of Cobh and the Titanic Trail to see the buildings, streets and piers where Titanic passengers embarked. Visit the Titanic Experience, situated in the original offices of The White Star Line. Return to Kinsale for overnight and a full Irish breakfast at your hotel.

Day 8 (T) – Kinsale to Dublin

Visit the Rock of Cashel, the most photographed site in Ireland. Towering over the town of Cashel from its perch on a 200-foot-high outcrop of limestone, the Rock of Cashel was once the seat of the Kings of Munster. St. Patrick visited the rock in 450 A.D. Granted to the church in the 12th century by the O'Brien clan, the Rock became the seat of the archbishop of Cashel. Today, impressive stone walls enclose a round tower, cathedral, Romanesque chapel and high crosses. Continue to Dublin and enjoy a panoramic tour of "Dublin's Fair City" with its elegant Georgian squares, Christchurch (built by the Anglo-Norman's in 1172) and the Phoenix Park with its many monuments, including the Papal cross. Enjoy dinner, overnight and a full Irish breakfast at your hotel in Dublin.

Day 9 - (W) - Dublin's Fair City

Start the day at St. Patrick's Cathedral, built next to the well where Patrick baptized converts on his visit to Dublin. The present building dates from 1220 and is the National Cathedral of the Church of Ireland (Anglican). St Patrick's is adorned with funeral monuments, including the Boyle Family Memorial and the grave of Jonathan Swift, author of Gulliver's Travels and pastor here until 1745. In 1789, Wesley led a

large number of Dublin Methodists to the Cathedral for the administration of Holy Communion, and replicas of the chalices are displayed in a special case there. Stop at Whitefriar Street Carmelite Church, built in 1752 and the first Methodist chapel in Ireland. Visit the site of St. Mary's Church, where John Wesley preached his first sermon in Ireland to 'as gay and senseless a congregation as ever I saw,' an occasion commemorated with a brass plate displayed at the nearest Methodist Church, the Dublin Central Mission. In 1986, St. Mary's became a popular restaurant known as the Church Pub, where you will enjoy lunch (included). Visit Trinity College to see one of Ireland's most illustrious books, the 9th century "Book of Kells." Explore the long room's collection of over 200,000 books and manuscripts of Trinity's oldest volumes as well as Brian Boru's harp and a copy of the 1916 proclamation. Enjoy dinner and entertainment at Merry Ploughboys Pub, a state-of-the-art music venue featuring contemporary Irish dancing and well-known guest artists. Overnight and a full Irish breakfast are at your hotel in Dublin.

SCOTLAND PRE-TOUR July 23 - 27, 2016 \$1198*

Day 1 (S) - Depart USA

Day 2 (U) - Arrive in Glasgow or Edinburgh, Holyrood

Arrive in Scotland and be met at the airport by your guide and bus and transferred to Edinburgh. Descend the Royal Mile to the Palace of Holyrood, where John Knox confronted Mary, Queen of the Scots. Dinner and overnight are in the Edinburgh area.

Day 3 (M) - Dunfermline Abbey, St. Andrews Church & Castle

Cross the Firth of Forth to Fife. Stop at Dunfermline Abbey, where St. Margaret and Robert the Bruce are buried. Continue past picturesque fishing villages to St. Andrew's, the ancient ecclesiastical capital of Scotland. Visit the ruins of St. Andrew's Cathedral and the nearby castle with its notorious "Bottle Dungeon" where John Knox and other Reformers were held prisoner. Take a look at the "Old Course" at St. Andrew's,

renowned as the home of golf. Return to Edinburgh for dinner and overnight.

Day 4 (T) - Edinburgh Castle, John Knox House, St. Giles, Princes Street
This morning you will begin to explore the city that has played an important part in our Presbyterian heritage. Tour Edinburgh Castle, birthplace of King James VI who authorized the King James Bible. Visit the
historic John Knox House where the reformer stayed while in Scotland.
See St. Giles Cathedral, the high Kirk of Edinburgh, where John Knox was
minister following the Scottish Reformation. Continue down the Princes
Street to the Sir Walter Scott Monument. Transfer for evening flight to
Dublin.

Day 5 (W) – Meet up with those arriving for the Ireland tour at Dublin airport.

BELFAST EXTENSION August 4 - 7, 2016 \$1098*

Day 10 (H) - Malahide Castle

Leave Dublin this morning and head for the pretty seaside town of Malahide. Set on 250 acres of park land, Malahide Castle was both a fortress and a private home for nearly eight hundred years. The Talbot family lived here from 1185 to 1973, when the last Lord Talbot died. The house is furnished with beautiful period furniture together with an extensive collection of Irish portrait paintings, mainly from the National Gallery. Continue to Downpatrick to visit St. Patrick's final resting place as well as explore the life of St. Patrick at the Heritage Center. Check into your Belfast area hotel for dinner and overnight.

Day 11 (F) - Antrim Coast and Giants Causeway

As you travel along the Antrim Coast, you'll experience breathtaking views of the Irish Sea and hauntingly beautiful moorlands, but the grand finale is the Giant's Causeway. Sometimes dubbed "The 8th Wonder of the World", the Causeway is an amazing sight with its 40,000 basalt columns rising from the sea. Legend has it that the Causeway was the

path built by Irish giant Finn McCool to enable him to fight the giant across the Irish Sea in Scotland. Pass through the Northern Ireland countryside back to Belfast for dinner and overnight.

Day 12 (S) – Belfast

Today you will enjoy a tour of the city of Belfast. Belfast has been the scene of much conflict between the Roman Catholics and Protestants, culminating in the "Troubles." While visiting Belfast, see the remains of the famous ship yards where ships like the Titanic were built. Visit the East Belfast Mission where Wesley's emphasis on reaching the poor and working class people is put into action. Travel back to Dublin for dinner and overnight.

Day 13 (U) - Return Home

Transfer to the airport for your return flight home, with memories of Wesley and the people of Ireland that share in this rich, Christian heritage.
