August 15 – Depart the USA

August 16 – Arrive in Paris

Greet & meet assistant at CDG airport. Transfer to the Paris hotel via a private coach.

August 17 – Half Day Panoramic tour of Paris

Panoramic tour of the Capital with inside visit of Notre Dame Cathedral (except during mass Saturday PM & Sunday), Place de la Concorde, Tuileries, the Louvre, Carrousel, Pont Neuf, Cité Island, Notre-Dame cathedral, Hotel de Ville, Place des Vosges, Bastille square and New Opéra, Saint-Louis Island, left bank, Sorbonne University, Latin quarter, Panthéon, Luxembourg Gardens and Palace, Saint-Germain-des-Prés, Assemblée Nationale, Invalides, Eiffel Tower, Palais de Chaillot, Arc de Triomphe, Champs-Elysées, Grand-Palais, Elysée Palace, Madeleine church, Opéra Garnier House, rue de la Paix, Vendôme Square.

August 18 – Full day Versailles, castle, gardens, and Trianons

Listed as a UNESCO World Heritage Site for 30 years, the Versailles Palace was the residence of the French kings Louis XIV, Louis XV, and Louis XVI and their court from 1682 until the French Revolution in 1789. You will discover the magnificent Palace of Versailles in the company of your guide: its baroque architecture, its artistic masterpieces, its sumptuous decorations, as well as its furniture made by the greatest craftsmen of the time. After your visit to the Palace, your guide will show you the sumptuous formal gardens designed by Le Nôtre ...Peaceful and inspiring, the majestic park stretches out on either side of the Grand Canal, inviting its guests to take a long and refreshing walk. Along the paths, you will discover a marvelous succession of marble statues, fountains, ponds, flowerbeds, and groves. Enjoy a three-course lunch, including a beverage. Our guide will take you to Marie Antoinette's Trianon property and the Queen's Hamlet, an intimate and preserved space with bucolic charm, situated away from the park. Far from the splendor of the Château, the Property of Marie-Antoinette is made up of the Petit Trianon and the Hamlet. Timeless, a place for receptions and walks, it exalts the imagination with its bucolic layouts and rural architecture.

August 19 – Enjoy a private transfer from the Paris hotel to the ship.

Itinerary

August 18 – Depart the USA

Depart the USA on your international overnight flight.

August 19 – Arrive in Paris

Arrive in Paris and be transferred to the beautiful Amadeus Diamond.

August 20 – Conflans St. Honorine

Visit Van Gogh's tomb at Auvers-sur-Oise village, and view Auberge Ravoux. A place of inspiration for painters like Vincent van Gogh, Camille Pissarro, Claude Monet, Charles-François Daubigny, and many others—each of whom left a mark of their genius. The village of Auvers-sur-Oise has preserved this precious heritage, allowing you to relive the birth and fulfillment of the Impressionist movement. Many famous painters immortalized the sights and surroundings of Auvers-sur-Oise. Vincent Van Gogh painted seventy paintings here during his last month of life. See Van Gogh's last housing at "l'Auberge Ravoux" in Auvers-sur-Oise, where he lived in a modest attic room, lighted by a simple dormer, and where Theo Van Gogh assisted his brother in his last moments. Walk the way of Van Gogh, which recounts the artist's stay in Auvers-sur-Oise, through his works, letters, and photographs. The spectator is invited to discover Auvers-sur-Oise through the eyes of the talented painter Van Gogh. Lunch today will be on the ship.

August 21 – Rouen

Walking tour of Rouen, medieval town, Cathedral, and Joan of Arc Church. The capital of Normandy, situated on a bend of the Seine River, was the second most important city in France during the Middle Ages, thanks to its harbor and thriving trade. Ravaged by the Vikings, the Hundred Years' War, and the Second World War, the city always "got back on its feet" to offer all the charms of a provincial metropolis. Your guide will be your best asset to wander in the car-free streets of the historical part of town. He will take you to the Gros Horloge, a symbol of the city, and the façade of the Cathedral Notre-Dame, which inspired Claude Monet for his world-famous series of paintings. Don't miss the Old Market Square, witness to the last breath of the Maid of Orleans. Lunch today will be on the ship.

August 22 – Le Havre

An Unforgettable Day Along the D-Day Beaches - Begin your day with a visit to Pointe du Hoc, a strategic site fortified by German troops during World War II. This location was the scene of the American Rangers' landing operations in June 1944. Pointe du Hoc offers breathtaking views of the ocean and serves as a significant memorial commemorating the bravery of the soldiers who fought there. Lunch at L'Épicerie (3 courses with beverage) near Omaha Beach. Next, head to Omaha Beach, one of the most famous Normandy landing beaches. It was here that Allied forces suffered significant human losses during Operation Overlord. A visit to Omaha Beach is a poignant experience that allows you to understand the scale of the sacrifices made for freedom. Today, the beach is a place of reflection and remembrance, marked by numerous monuments and memorials. Close to Omaha Beach is the American Cemetery at Colleville-sur-Mer. This American cemetery is a vast necropolis that holds the graves of thousands of American soldiers who fell during the Battle of Normandy. The site also features a modern visitor center, where interactive exhibits, films, and presentations share the personal stories of the soldiers and recount the events of D-Day. Visiting the American Cemetery is a solemn and moving moment that honors the memory of the heroes of World War II. Lunch today will be provided at a local restaurant.

August 23 – Le Havre

La Havre, (Church of Saint Joseph and Town of Auguste Perret), is the largest city in Normandy. It is nicknamed by its inhabitants as an allusion to LA and Los Angeles. Founded by King François I in 1517, the harbor developed rapidly due to trade with the New World and North Africa. A race between corsairs and shipowners started then to explore the wealth located on the other side of the Atlantic. The peak was tragically stopped by the hail of bombs that fell onto the city

at the end of World War II. During your guided tour of Le Havre, you will discover the creations of two famous architects of the 20th century: the Church of St. Joseph and the City Hall by Auguste Perret, and Le Volcan by Oscar Niemeyer. Its UNESCO-listed perimeter offers large avenues for strolls and bright perspectives, features that probably seduced the impressionist and Fauvist painters. Lunch in Le Havre or Honfleur. An unmissable Norman port on the Côte Fleurie, south of the Seine estuary, Honfleur and its picturesque harbor invite leisurely strolling. Spared the destruction of the Second World War, this town, over a thousand years old, fascinates and enchants, as the poet Charles Baudelaire wrote: "My settling in Honfleur has always been the dearest of my dreams." Follow your guide along the quays of the Old Basin, where many artists, past and present, enjoy setting up their easels. Your steps will then lead you to the Lieutenantcy and to the 17th-century salt warehouses, once essential to the cod-fishing trade. Let yourself also be charmed by the narrow streets lined with half-timbered houses, and by the wells and washhouses that punctuate the town. Lunch today will be provided at a local restaurant.

August 24 – Les Andelys and Vernon

In Les Andelys, between Paris and Rouen, Château Gaillard overlooks one of the most beautiful meanders of the river Seine. Built by Richard the Lionheart in 1198, it barred the river Seine before Rouen to protect the Duchy of Normandy. After the death of Richard the Lionheart in 1199, his brother, John Lackland, inherited it. However, in 1204, King Philip II Augustus seized it, thereby making the Duchy of Normandy part of the Kingdom of France. Nowadays, the site offers a stunning view of the splendid Seine Valley. Built in only one year and so proud of his work, Richard the Lionheart exclaimed, "How beautiful she is, my one-year-old daughter! What a 'gaillard' castle." ("gaillard" here means well-fortified). This afternoon, visit Giverny. A village nestled in the heart of the Vexin, and a source of inspiration for the most impressionist of painters. A landscape gardener passionate about horticulture, an indefatigable painter and great collector: a forward-thinking artist in search of perfection. The clos normand (flower garden), and the water garden: his gardens, his masterwork. The harmony of colors, the quest for light in his studio, his boat, the nearby fields... When Claude Monet glanced out of the window of his train and caught sight of the village of Giverny, 80 km west of Paris, he decided then and there that this was where he wanted to live and work. And so he did, from 1883 until his death in 1926. The beautiful surroundings, vividly colored flora, and gentle atmosphere of the place became some of the biggest sources of inspiration for his work. Lunch today will be on the ship.

August 25 – Paris

Those who did not participate in the Paris Pre-Tour will have a panoramic tour of Paris:

Panoramic tour of the Capital to include, Place de la Concorde, Tuileries, the Louvre, Carrousel, Pont Neuf, Cité Island, Hotel de Ville, Place des Vosges, Bastille square and New Opéra, Saint-Louis Island, left bank, Sorbonne University, Latin quarter, Panthéon, Luxembourg Gardens and Palace, Saint-Germain-des-Prés, Assemblée Nationale, Invalides, Eiffel Tower, Palais de Chaillot, Arc de Triomphe, Champs-Élysées, Grand-Palais, Elysée Palace, Madeleine church, Opéra Garnier House, rue de la Paix, Vendôme Square.

Those who have already taken the panoramic tour of Paris will have the option of a walking tour of the Left Bank or Montmartre. Lunch today will be on the ship.

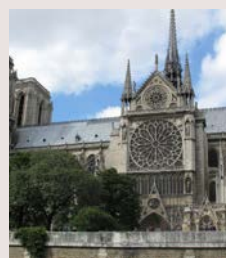

August 26 – High-Speed Train to Zurich

Say goodbye to the Amadeus Diamond cruise ship, docked at Port de Javel Bas, and transfer to the Paris Gare de Lyon train station. Board the TGV high-speed train to Zurich, Switzerland (1st Class with seat reservations). Your guide and tour bus will await you at the main station in Zurich. After lunch at a local restaurant in Zurich, begin a walking tour. Visit Fraumünster Church and Grossmünster Church. Tour the Lindt Chocolate Factory Museum and taste freshly made chocolate at the chocolate fountain. Travel approximately one hour to Lucerne for dinner and an overnight stay.

August 27 – Lucerne

After breakfast at the hotel, begin a walking tour of Lucerne. Board a lake cruise for a one-hour trip to Alpnachstad. From there, take a cogwheel train up to Mount Pilatus. Enjoy some free time at the top for exploration and photos. Have lunch at the Pilatus Kulm Mountain. Take the cable car down to Kriens and enjoy a leisurely bus ride back to Lucerne. Enjoy an evening folklore show and cheese fondue evening before returning to the hotel for an overnight stay.

August 28 – Grindelwald, Montreaux, and Geneva

This morning, after breakfast, enjoy a scenic drive to Grindelwald. Enjoy some free time to explore this idyllic fairy-tale village in the Swiss Alps. Have lunch at a local restaurant and head to Interlaken to board the Golden Pass Train to Montreaux. Travel to Geneva by bus for dinner and an overnight stay.

August 29 – Transfer to the Geneva Airport and fly back to the USA.
