October 1 - Sorrento

Travel to Castel Gandolfo, the pope's summer residence. The Romans also preferred this area in the summer to get out of the heat. Enjoy the incredible beauty of this region as your bus travels to Sorrento. You will be in awe of the dramatic cliff-top drive that leads to your hotel. During your three-night stay, you'll have time to discover the colorful ambiance of this delightful town and enjoy the view of Mount Vesuvius.

October 2 - Amalfi Coast

The Amalfi Coast is considered to be one of Italy's finest! You will be enchanted by the rich hues of the blue-green sea, the tiny mystical islands, and the pastel-colored cottages gathered around tiny harbors! Have your camera ready to capture one breathtaking view after another! Snap a photo of the famous village of Positano, which has graced a thousand postcards and charmed at least three generations of travelers. Visit the town of Amalfi, a must for every visitor! A glorious maritime republic from the 9th to 12th centuries, the town is famous as the place where the compass was invented and boasts a splendid Duomo in Arab-Norman style. Time permitting, you'll stop at the village of Vietri Sul Mar, home of Amalfi Coast ceramic factories, which produce the colorful tiles that decorate every church tower in the area.


October 3 - Capri


Enjoy a boat ride to the lovely Isle of Capri, which has enticed visitors for thousands of years. Today, you will have the opportunity to savor its beauty and be captivated by the fabulous views and elegant shops.

October 4 - Pompeii

You will visit the spectacular ruins of Pompeii, which were covered by the eruption of Mount Vesuvius in 79 AD. The city remained buried and undiscovered for almost 1,500 years until 1748. Excavations continue today and provide insight into life during the Roman Empire. Continue to the Rome area for dinner and your overnight stay.

October 5 - Join up with the arriving group in Rome (Day two of basic tour).





October 4 - Depart from the USA

October 5 - Arrive in Rome

Arrive at the airport in Rome and transfer to your hotel. Enjoy an afternoon walk to St. Peter's Square with local church member, Michael Wright, who will orient you and lead the group in the singing of hymns in St. Peter's Square.

October 6 - Rome

Start the day with a worship and communion service. Today, you'll explore the differences between the Empire's efforts for peace (Pax Romana) and Christ's peace (Pax Christi) by visiting Augustus' Altar of Peace or Ara Pacis. After a traditional kosher lunch, we'll explore the history of Rome's Jewish Quarter.

October 7 - Rome

Indulge in a leisurely morning exploring the Eternal City independently. In the afternoon, embark on a pilgrimage-themed walking tour with a local art historian, beginning at Piazza del Popolo, the historic entry point for early Christians, to discover sacred sites throughout Rome.

October 8 - The Vatican

Today we'll explore the Vatican Museums and the Sistine Chapel with an art historian. Uncover the museum's 16th-century origins, revealing its powerful mission of witnessing creation's beauty and evangelizing through art.

October 9 - Subiaco and Tivoli

This morning, depart Rome and travel to Subiaco to explore early Western monasticism. Enjoy a guided visit to the 1,000-year-old Benedictine monastery, Sacro Speco, and learn also about how Benedict developed the ideas for the Order. You will hear about the monastery of Santa Scholastica, the sister monastery that was built 500 years earlier. Participate in a devotional before continuing to Tivoli for lunch and finally arrive in Assisi this evening.

October 10 - Assisi

This morning, we'll celebrate in a worship service in the City of Peace. Then, enjoy a walking tour of Assisi including the Basilica of St. Francis of Assisi and other Franciscan sites, sharing his story as well as St. Clare's. After lunch, travel to Florence and check into your hotel. Enjoy the evening on your own.

October 11 - Florence

Embark on a journey through faith and art with a local art historian, tracing the evolution from the Middle Ages to the Renaissance. Explore iconic sites like the Accademia, Duomo and its baptistry, and the Museum of the Works of the Cathedral, featuring masterpieces by Michelangelo, Ghiberti, and Donatello. Then, savor free time in the afternoon and evening.

October 12 - Pisa and Pinerolo

Today, discover Pisa's unique blend of Islamic influences in Medieval Christian architecture. Visit the 12th-century Romanesque cathedral, the Baptistry, and see the iconic Leaning Tower. After lunch, venture to the Waldensian Valleys near Turin, cradle of Italian Protestantism and the Restoration movement's introduction to Italy.

October 13 - Torre Pellice

Participate in morning worship at the Waldensian Community's headquarters near Mount Vandelino, also known as Mount Brigham after Brigham Young. Explore the village independently, then delve into the Waldensian Museum in the afternoon to unravel the history of this once-oppressed religious minority. Conclude the day with a farewell dinner featuring a talk on John Avondet, Italy's first Missionary of the Reorganization, who originated from these valleys.

October 14 - Return to the USA

Transfer to the airport for your return flight home.

October 14 - Matterhorn and Zermatt

Travel to Zermatt at the foot of the Matterhorn. Take the incline Railway to the top and then return down to Zermatt for your hotel stay. (B, D)

October 15 - Day on your own in Zermatt

Today is yours to explore and experience Zermatt. Relax, shop or transverse one of the many hiking trails on your own. (B)

October 16 - Interlaken to Lucerne

This morning travel to Interlaken, the heart of Switzerland, surrounded by the towering nearby peaks of the Jungfrau, Eiger and Monch. Enjoy free time to wander, shop and explore this town between two lakes. Travel across incredible Swiss mountain ranges, catch glimpses of glaciers and travel through breathtaking mountains. This afternoon travel to Lucerne. (B, D)

October 17 - Day tour of Lucerne

Tour beautiful Lucerne today. The 14th century city wall, boasting nine different watchtowers, is one of the best preserved fortifications in Europe. The colorful painted panels of Lucerne's famous wooden Kappel Bridge depict the city's history. See the twin- towered Jesuit Church, which is one of the most handsome baroque buildings in Switzerland. We will also view the sad and famous Lion Monument of Lucerne, which Mark Twain called the most mournful and moving piece of stone in the world. (B, D)

October 18 - Zurich

This morning, travel to Zurich. Zurich was home to Huldrich Zwingli, a contemporary of Luther and Calvin, who led the call for Reformation. Zwingli served as pastor of the Grossmunster (Great Church) in the 1520's. Two other churches here deserve attention. The Fraumunster (Our Lady's Church) has portions of architecture dating to the 13th century, and boasts stained glass windows by Marc Chagall. Finally St. Peter's Church has the largest church clockface in the world. Check in to your hotel for overnight. (B, D)
