ITINERARY



July 16 - Depart USA

Depart the US on your international flight to **Istanbul**.

July 17 - Istanbul

Arrive in **Istanbul** and walk through thousands of years of history at the **Istanbul Archaeological Museums**, a cluster of three museums that house approximately one million artifacts, including the tomb of Alexander the Great and the Kadesh Treaty. Take a **boat ride** on the Bosphorus, the world's narrowest natural strait used for international navigation. Connecting the Black Sea with the Sea of Marmara, the straight acts as a continental boundary between Europe and Asia, separating Anatolia from Thrace.

July 18 - Istanbul

Explore the spectacular **Hagia Sophia**. Originally built as the world's largest church, it has also been used as a mosque (current use) and a museum in different eras. The **Sultan Ahmed Mosque**, also known as the **Blue Mosque** for its beautiful blue tiles, was built in 537 AD and remains a functioning house of prayer to this day. Famous for its massive dome, you will notice the culmination of two centuries' worth of architecture, Ottoman and Byzantine. Be prepared to take your shoes off and wear mosque-appropriate clothing when entering. Continue your time in Istanbul with a visit to **Chora Church**, originally built right outside the city walls of ancient Constantinople. Today Chora Church is one of the most remarkable remnants of the Byzantine Empire with exquisite mosaics depicting the infancy of Christ, miracles of Christ, the journey of the Magi, and much more. Explore the underbelly of Istanbul within the **Basilica Cistern**. This massive water temple carved from the earth in 532 AD holds busts of Medusa and the iconic Column of Tears. Enjoy a look at modern Turkish culture when you explore the **Grand Turkish Bazaar**, first established in 1461. Peruse intricate textiles, beautiful light fixtures, world famous carpets, aromatic herbs and spices, and much more. Fly to Izmir, Ancient Smyrna after touring today.

July 19 - Izmir

Tour **Pergamum** today. This city, most favored of the Seven Churches of John's Revelation, was praised for its forbearance during hard times. As you pass through the Royal Gates, you will enter one of the great centers of classic Greek culture. You will see the foundations of the **Temple of Zeus**, the **Temple of Athena**, and the ruins of the **Library** which once held 200,000 parchment volumes. You will also see the remains of the **Temple of Trajan**, the **Grand Theatre**, the **Gymnasium**, and the **Health Center (Aesclepiion)**. Visit **Thyatira**, the modern city of Akhisar, located on a trade route south east of the capital Pergamum. More trade guilds were known in Thyatira than any other Asian city. A period of great prosperity was only beginning when the seven letters were written.

July 20 - Ephesus

Travel south to tour **Selcuk** and tour **Ephesus**, where the apostle Paul spent three years of his ministry. Visit the Agora and the Library. Stroll through the great theater where Paul witnessed faithfully for Christ. Not far away is the stadium where chariot races took place and gladiatorial combats were held. View the terrace houses which give a true impression of the ancient lifestyle of the rich. Travel to the **Basilica of St. John**, believed to be built over the remains of the Apostle John. Modeled after the now lost Church of the Holy Apostles, this basilica was originally built in the 6th century, during the reign of Emperor Justinian I. Enjoy a visit to an authentic Turkish carpet factory.

July 21 - Sardis & Philadelphia

Journey north to tour **Sardis**, the capital of the Lydian empire and one of the greatest cities of the ancient world. This city was a central location for trade and was exhorted to wake up and be strong by John in his Revelation. You will be impressed by the massive scale of the **Temple of Artemis**, white marble **Royal Road**, **gymnasium** and **synagogue**. **Philadelphia** was founded in 189 BC by King Eumenes II of Pergamum (197-160 BC), who named the city for the love of his brother who would be his successor, Attalus II (159-138 BC). Like nearby Sardis, it was hit with a devastating earthquake in 17 AD; the city was rebuilt with the help of Emperor Tiberius.

July 22 - Laodicea, Colossae & Hierapolis

The ancient Hellenistic city of **Laodicea** was established on the site of a former settlement under the Seleucid dynasty in the mid-3rd century BC. Laodicea was reputed for its sheep's soft black wool and was a weaving center famous for both its wool and cotton fabrics. The remains of Laodicea consist of a Hellenistic theatre, a smaller Roman theatre, a rectangular council building, a water tower, a stadium, a gymnasium and baths, a nymphaeum, a church, and a necropolis. **Colossae** Ancient City is one of the most important centers in Great Phrygia. The city lived its brightest times under the Persian rule. At **Hierapolis**, a UNESCO World Heritage Site, the hot springs have been used as a spa since the 2nd century BCE. people came to soothe their ailments, with many of them retiring or dying here. The large necropolis is filled with sarcophagi, including the Sarcophagus of Marcus Aurelius Ammianus.

July 23 - Antioch of Psidia & Iconium

Antioch of Psidia is an archaeological site that enchant visitors with its glorious past. The city was founded in the Hellenistic period by Antiochus I Soter. The name "Antioch" was often used by Antiochus I when founding new settlements and renaming the already existing towns. He founded as many as 16 new Antiochs in Asia Minor and the Middle East. The term "Pisidian" is frequently added to its name, to distinguish this city from others. Tour the ancient city of **Iconium**, modern **Konya**, one of the principal cities in the Roman province of Galatia and on the main trade route from Ephesus to Syria. Paul and Barnabas, after being forced to leave Antioch, preached in the city and synagogue of Iconium and led many Jews and Greeks to believe in Christ.

July 24 - Cappadocia

Travel to **Cappadocia** and visit the **Mevlana Museum**, resting place of the 13th century Persian poet Rumi (Mevlana). Built in the 13th century and expanded until the 19th century, the Museum is famous for its turquoise tiled tower and exquisite examples of Ottoman calligraphy and inscriptions. Enjoy a panoramic tour of Cappadocia before settling into your cave hotel for dinner and overnight.

July 25 - Cappadocia

Early in the morning enjoy an optional balloon ride, pending weather conditions. Visit the **Göreme Open Air Museum** where Orthodox monks carved out the soft rocks to form beautiful houses, churches, and monasteries between the 10th and 13th centuries. A UNESCO World Heritage Site and the most popular attraction in Cappadocia, these Christian sanctuaries contain spectacular examples of Byzantine art from the post-iconoclastic period. The frescos are a unique artistic achievement from this period. Travel to the Zelve Valley, an amazing cave town honeycombed with homes, religious and secular chambers. Occupied until the 1950s, when erosion of the land became too risky for the inhabitants. Enjoy learning about the ancient religious rites of the **Whirling Dervishes** this evening and attend a performance.

July 26 - Cappadocia

Enjoy **Uchisar**, situated at the highest point of Cappadocia. The top of the **Uchisar Castle** provides a magnificent panorama of the surrounding area with Mount Erciyes in the distance. Many rooms carved into the rock are connected to each other through stairs, tunnels and passages. Visit **Avanos**, the center of Cappadocian pottery manufacture. There are nearly 300 pottery ateliers using the same techniques as the Neolithic men of Anatolia, namely the ancient revolving potter's wheel. Explore the **Ozkonak Underground City**, situated 5 miles North of Avanos. Dating back to 400 BC, this unique city hollowed out of tufa rock was built by the locals to defend themselves against invasions. This glorious structure reflects the dreamy historical atmosphere through its architectural characteristic and geopolitical situation.

July 27 - Antalya

Drive to **Antalya** via Sultan Han, the Neolithic site of Catalhoyuk. The **Sultan Han** is a 13th century caravanserai, an elaborate stop-over inn for travelers and merchants on the Silk Road, and a prime example of the Seljuks-era civic architecture, leaving an unforgettable effect on visitors.

July 28 - Antalya

Enjoy full day city tour including **Perge**, **Aspendos** and the **Antalya Archaeological Museum**. Settled by the Hittites around 1500 BC, Perge was an important city in Pamphylia (today's Mediterranean region) due to the Kestros (Aksu) river allowing for navigation via waterway. It is where St. Paul started his journeys and preached his first sermon in 46 AD. Aspendos is famous for its well-preserved theater of antiquity built in the 2nd century AD with a capacity of 15,000 people. Still used today for performances and festivals, the theater's galleries, stage decorations and acoustics testify to its architect Xenon's success. Next to the stage there is a small room which is used as a small museum where you can view ancient masks and clay tickets. Nearby stands the remains of a basilica, agora and one of the largest aqueducts in **Anatolia**. Also visit the acropolis of the city with a great view of the river. Visit the **Antalya Museum**, or **Antalya Archeological Museums**, one of Turkey's largest museums. It includes 13 exhibition halls and an open-air gallery, illuminating the history of the Mediterranean and Pamphylia regions in Anatolia. In addition to exhibits on display, a further 25,000 - 30,000 artifacts are in storage.

July 29 - Fly home from Antalya

Return home with a better appreciation of this important biblical region.
